We look forward to seeing everyone again at the next Inspire Educamps summer camp!

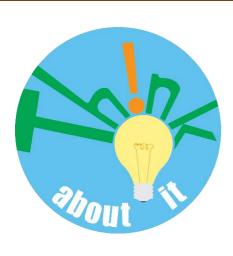


Activities
